

The Dept. of Education strongly advises against converting this score to a letter grade as the rubric is **not** based on a 100 point scale. One way to view this score is as follows: if the schools merely “met the requirements of the Anti-Bullying Law” in the 8 categories, it would then have obtained a score of 52. Clearly, an overall score of 71 demonstrates that the District schools exceeded the requirements of the Anti-Bullying Rights Law in many areas. This is a product of a commitment to safer schools by the Principals and the continued hard work of the building Anti-Bullying Specialist and their fellow staff.
